From Ute Gacs

Ute offers to go to Carson City with anyone interested in attending the Nevada Archeological Site Stewardship Basic Training class to be held on May 14, 2011 at the BLM Carson District Office in Carson City, Nevada from 9 am to 3:30 pm. This class is free of charge and open to all individuals interested in volunteering to help preserve Nevada's heritage through checking and reporting on the condition of sites on Public Lands.

The class covers historic preservation and archaeological laws, site etiquette, reporting and safety and will allow volunteers to steward sites throughout Nevada. After certification an additional 4-hours of field training is required before volunteers are assigned to monitor the condition of an archaeological site. The stewards visit their sites at least four times a year and report their findings to the archaeologist for the responsible land agency. This information is then used to help manage the archaeological and paleontological resources located on Public Lands.


